

Rom-Rymer Receives the National Register's Wellner Lifetime Achievement Award

We are pleased to inform you that Beth Rom-Rymer, PhD was recently awarded the National Register's Wellner Lifetime Achievement Award.

Dr. Rom-Rymer received her undergraduate degree in psychology from Princeton University in 1973, as a member of the first class of women at Princeton. She received her M.A. and Ph.D. in clinical psychology from The University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, with an emphasis on community organization and gerontology.

Dr. Rom-Rymer is a leader in the successful introduction and implementation of Illinois' legislation to allow doctors of psychologists trained in clinical psychopharmacology to prescribe psychotropic medications.
